The Evolution of the SHS Uniform over 35 Years

At SHS, the uniform has probably changed over the years... but how much did it actually change? Mr. Burns, the drama teacher at SHS, was also a fellow student many years ago. He said, "The SHS uniform has actually remained almost the same over the years. The #1 uniform has mostly remained the same." He also said that, "The ties, blazers and grey flannels were all the same."

Mr. Adamson says, "[25 years ago, Grade 3-8] Boys wore their striped shirts, ties, grey pants, black belts, dark socks, as well as shiny, black dress shoes each day. The boys would change into their PE clothes before and after PE.

For the boys in the Primary division (JK-Grade 2), they would wear a white SHS golf shirt, or a long-sleeved white SHS golf shirt in the colder months along with their grey pants and black shoes.

They would wear their PE clothes for the half of the day when they had PE and would change at lunchtime. This was how the uniform was worn for at least my first 10 years at the school [1996-2006]."

In 2005, Ms. Kester made this new dress code called the warm dress code. In the colder months, you would wear the regular #1 dress, but in the warmer months, you would wear a white SHS golf shirt, khaki beige shorts, a black belt, dark socks, and black dress shoes. Once the colder weather would arrive, boys would switch back to wearing #1 dress again until later in the spring. The warm dress still exists today and was started in 2005 by Ms. Kester.

Mr. Adamson, a teacher that has been teaching at SHS for over 25 years, says his estimation for what the uniform will be like in the next 10 years.

He says, "I don't know. I don't think we will have a major change for a while. However, you never know when something new will be introduced. Our uniform this year is new, there may be some minor tweaks next year as we get it just right. However, I do not think there will be a major change in the next 10 years." Overall, the uniform hasn't had any major changes so far in the last 25 years. Everything has stayed quite similar. There will probably be some minor changes in the future, but we never know if there will be a major one. What do you think will happen in the future? 8:40am Assembly Friday
